Today's Ceremony

Welcome to Columbus State University's spring semester commencement. Three different ceremonies today will celebrate this milestone in your academic journey. While today's celebration varies greatly from our traditional graduation recognition ceremony, it nonetheless diminishes the special achievement and recognition our graduates deserve. We celebrate each of you and your efforts, which have been supported by your family and friends, your classmates, and CSU's faculty and staff.

Today's ceremony does present some specific requirements to preserve the health and safety of everyone present, as well as the decorum such an academic ceremony deserves. Those include:

- adhering to the directions provided by parking attendants, public safety officers and others who are responsible for the safety of everyone and their vehicles.
- remaining in your vehicle for the entire ceremony. The only exception should be if the need for a restroom arises, in which case restrooms are located in the Ice Rink and by the staging parking lot. Staff can help direct you.
- refraining from playing loud music before, during and upon exiting the ceremony.
- turning off your vehicle's ignition to reduce noise and emissions (and to preserve your battery life) once you are parked.
- wearing a face covering anytime you find yourself interacting with someone else during the ceremony. This includes graduates at the time they are receiving their diploma tube.

Adapting our ceremony to today's drive-in format will require us to rely on some pre-recordings of traditional ceremony programming. It also requires us to abbreviate the program itself by eliminating some time-honored performances and remarks. Our Commencement Ceremony Planning Committee has worked to make today's event a memorable one considering these limitations, and we appreciate your understanding.

On behalf of the entire administration, faculty, staff and alumni of Columbus State University, congratulations to each of our graduates, and thanks to everyone present today who helped make their special day possible.

CSU's History is Intertwined with the city of Columbus

Shortly after World War II ended, the Columbus economy was booming and city officials set up several committees to plan for their community's future. As early as the 1940s, community leaders identified a college in Columbus as a priority. They began collecting money, looking for a site, and lobbying the state for their own college.

As the 1950s dawned, about 180 residents donated more than \$92,000 to help the Muscogee County School Board buy a hilly 157-acre dairy farm on the east edge of Columbus for what eventually would become Columbus State University's main campus.

Columbus residents also approved two bond issues to support then-Columbus College's creation, but many obstacles still had to be overcome, including the route of what would become Interstate 185. That's how the renovated Shannon Hosiery Mill on Talbotton Road became the college's temporary home when it first opened on Sept. 22, 1958. Nearly 300 students registered under the care of 15 faculty members and six administrators. This included the college's first president, Thomas Y. Whitley, who formerly was a special assistant working for the Regents System. Tuition and fees for the quarter were \$39.

From those humble beginnings, great things happened. The college moved to its permanent site in 1963 and became a four-year institution just two years later. Programs continued to grow and expand under President Whitley, who retired in 1979. President Francis Brooke then began his tenure and brought to the university a masterplan and a new collegiate structure.

After Dr. Brooke left in 1987, Frank Brown became CSU's third president. Even more growth followed and Dr. Brown saw many new buildings constructed on campus, including the school's signature clock tower, which was finished in 1991 and named after Dr. Whitley. Five years later, in 1996, the college was designated as a university and became Columbus State University. Before Dr. Brown retired in 2008, he helped guide the development of a downtown campus called CSU RiverPark and completed a \$100 million fundraising campaign that included the purchase of the university's own house in Oxford, England.

Timothy S. Mescon became Columbus State University's fourth president in August 2008. A former business dean at Kennesaw State University, Dr. Mescon guided the university through historic budget cuts while also pushing for higher academic standards. He ushered in several new graduate programs, including the university's first doctoral degree, and was president when Columbus State was named for the first time by *U.S. News & World Report* as one of the top 50 comprehensive public universities in the South. He strengthened the university's relationship with Fort Benning, expanded CSU's online degree offerings, added NCAA and club sports, and helped develop an Honors College on campus. He retired at the end of 2014.

Dr. Chris L. Markwood became Columbus State University's fifth president in June 2015, coming to Georgia from Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi, where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs.

Columbus State University welcomed its fifth president, Dr. Christopher L. Markwood, to his current role on June 1, 2015. Since then, he and his family have been active participants in the university and the greater Columbus communities. That involvement has helped spur one of his first priorities that has guided his presidency ever since: instituting an even greater sense of “communiversity” between CSU and its host community.

During his tenure, Columbus State has established itself as a leader in providing transformational learning experiences and producing graduates who are creative problem-solvers and high-impact leaders. This philosophy is a tenet of both his vision of CSU being one of the South’s most creative and impactful regional universities and its current five-year strategic plan.

Through his leadership, CSU has broadened its creativity, innovation and efficiency in its academic, operational and outreach efforts. This includes an intentional focus on servant leadership and engagement at all levels and within all university functions. This has resulted in new workforce development-focused degree programs, record enrollment, and increased standings in many national educational ranking programs.

His quarter-century in higher education has included a variety of academic responsibilities. Notably, these include appointments as the inaugural dean of the University of Central Oklahoma’s College of Arts, Media & Design; interim chancellor at the University of Wisconsin-Superior; and provost and vice president for academic affairs at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi.

A political scientist by academic training, Dr. Markwood holds three degrees in the field: a bachelor’s from Southwest Baptist University, and master’s and doctoral degrees from the University of Missouri-Columbia. He authored and edited “Oklahoma Government and Politics – an Introduction,” and has written numerous articles and made presentations nationally on political science and continuous improvement in higher education.

Georgia Trend Magazine has four times named Dr. Markwood as one of its 100 most influential Georgians. He currently serves as an executive committee member of the Peach Belt Conference, and previously served on the Georgia Council on Economic Education’s Board of Trustees and the University System of Georgia’s Comprehensive Administrative Review Steering Committee.

Closer to home, Dr. Markwood and his wife Bridget are longtime Rotarians and current members of the Columbus Rotary Club. They are the parents of a junior high-aged daughter, Reagan.

C. Robert Koon
*Honorary Doctorate of
Humane Letters*



C. Robert “Bob” Koon’s lengthy and distinguished career with Swift Textiles concluded with his retirement in 1990 as its chairman and CEO. During his tenure, he became one of the world’s foremost experts in the textile industry and saw firsthand the growth of denim from a work fabric to a fashion statement. As a result of his leadership, the Atlanta Textile Club named him its 1988 Textile Person of the Year Award, he was named as one of *Textile World Magazine’s* Top 10 Industry Leaders, and he was awarded the *American Textile International Magazine’s* 1989 Man of the Year award. He was named Columbus Business Leader of the Year in 1988.

As an active businessman in the Columbus community, Koon was a giant of his generation. Today, he remains a giant of our community — applying his business acumen and influence to bettering opportunities for others throughout the Chattahoochee Valley. He helped form the Columbus Regional Medical Foundation and the Muscogee County Excellence in Education Foundation, and served as a board member of Fulton Federal Savings & Loans. His community volunteerism spanning many decades includes service to the Medical Center Hospital Authority, Columbus Jaycees, Greater Columbus Chamber of Commerce, the United Way of the Chattahoochee Valley, the Chattahoochee Council of the Boy Scouts of America, the Georgia Council on Adult Literacy, the Rotary Club of Columbus, and countless committees for special projects and initiatives to enhance the lives of those who live in and around Columbus. Likewise, he has done the same through his church, St. Paul Methodist Church.

Bob and his wife, Joyce, have been leadership annual giving donors to Columbus State for decades. He has invested both his resources and time to Columbus State’s benefit — beginning in 1985 when he began serving as a trustee of the CSU Foundation. He was later selected to serve as the Foundation’s 1989-90 chair.

A longtime advocate for planned philanthropic giving, he played a pivotal role in establishing Columbus State University’s Legacy Society in 1998 to recognize individuals who notify the university that they have included CSU in their estate plans. Koon continues to chair the CSU Foundation Planned Giving Initiative.

In recognition of his long involvement with and generous support of Columbus State, the CSU Alumni Association named him an honorary alumnus in 2007. In 2020, at the conclusion of his service on the CSU Foundation Board, he was named a trustee *emeritus*.

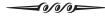

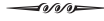

All business programs are distinguished by their accreditation by AACSB International – The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business. AACSB accreditation represents the highest standard of achievement for business schools worldwide. It is the hallmark of excellence in business education, and has been earned by less than 5% of the more than 16,000 schools worldwide granting business degrees. AACSB-accredited schools have the highest quality faculty, deliver a relevant and challenging curriculum, and provide educational and career opportunities that are generally not found at non-accredited schools.

The TSYS School has been designated by the U.S. National Security Agency (NSA) as a National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense Education. This designation was created by the NSA and the Department of Homeland Security to recognize schools that offer rigorous degree programs in information security. These distinctions validate the quality of the school's faculty and academic programs and increase the value of its graduates' degrees.



College of Education and Health Professions



The College of Education and Health Professions offers programs in Teacher Education, Educational Leadership, Counseling, Nursing, Health Science, and Exercise Science. With its 2,700-plus students and over 600 degrees awarded per year, the college is a significant contributor to the local and regional workforce.

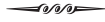

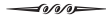
College of Letters and Sciences

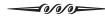

The History Of Academic Pageantry

The Academic Regalia

In its essential features, the academic regalia worn at American college exercises had its beginning in the Middle Ages. The oldest universities of Northern Europe grew out of church schools, and both faculty and students were regarded as a part of the clergy. As their regular costume, they wore the clerical garb that was borrowed largely from the monastic dress of their day.

The academic gown and hood were apparently first regularly adopted by Cambridge University in 1284 and by Oxford University a little later. The custom was transplanted to this country in colonial times by King's College in New York (now Columbia University).

In 1875, American universities and colleges decided to standardize their academic styles and developed the intercollegiate code of academic costume, which follows the Cambridge tradition. The distinctive caps, gowns and hoods worn at present-day college and university functions denote the institution that granted the degree, the field of learning in which the degree was earned, and the level of the degree – bachelor, master, or doctorate.

The gown is usually of black material (serge or worsted for bachelors, the same or silk for master's, and silk for doctors). Bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves; master's gowns have long, pouch-like sleeves that reputedly were once used to carry books, sandwiches, etc. Doctor's gowns are faced with panels of velvet down the front and three bars of velvet across each sleeve.

The cap is a square mortar-board in most American universities, and a round soft, flat velvet hat in British, Canadian, and some European universities. It bears a tassel, which may be colored according to the scholarly field of the wearer. Only the doctor's caps may be of velvet.

The hood, worn around the neck so as to hang down the back, is the principal emblem of the nature and source of the degree held. The colors in the hood lining are the colors of the college conferring the degree. The color of the border indicates the scholarly field of the college conferring the degree and the scholarly field of the wearer. Hoods may be worn only after the degree has been granted. Certain standard colors represent the disciplines.

The regalia of the president of Columbus State University, Dr. Chris Markwood, represent the university colors of red, white and blue.

The color facing the hood, like the facing on the doctoral gown, indicates:

The University Mace And Presidential Medallion

The word “mace” is derived from the Latin word *mateola*, meaning mallet or staff. In the Middle Ages, these staffs, with a ball of steel or brass at one end, were used as weapons against armored warriors. As the weapons of war became more sophisticated, the mace evolved from an instrument of battle to a symbol of authority and power.

Universities in Europe adopted the mace as a symbol of authority and unity. This tradition has continued to the present day, and many institutions of higher learning use the mace in a ceremonial capacity.

The Columbus State University mace is constructed of rosewood, Bastogne walnut, and sterling silver. Commissioned by the Columbus State University Foundation, the university mace and the presidential medallion were first used in the inauguration of Frank D. Brown as CSU’s third president. Originally designed and constructed by Jamie Howard, a CSU professor of art, the mace and medallion are two symbols of the office of the president. The medallion, augmented in 2012 with a chain and bronze border reflective of the university seal, is worn by the president at commencement and other ceremonial occasions. The silver part of the medallion bears a representation of the tree of knowledge.



CSU Colors

The official colors of Columbus State University are red, white and blue.

CSU Mascot

The Columbus State University mascot is the cougar.

CSU Motto

The motto of Columbus State University is *Primus Inter Pares*, Latin for “First Among Equals.”

The Academic Procession

The academic procession is a descendant of European religious processions, which began to include teaching faculties in the Middle Ages, when universities were closely associated with the medieval church. The order used in today's procession evolved in this country as the importance of ceremony developed in American institutions of higher learning.

Leading the procession is the mace-bearer. In medieval times, the mace bearer literally used the mace to maintain order at official occasions. Today, the mace is symbolic of the authority of the president's office. The mace-bearers in today's ceremony are the college faculty marshals. They will escort the stage party consisting of the president, vice presidents, deans and others.



University Gonfalons

The Columbus State University gonfalons, which are the distinctive college banners hanging from crosspieces on poles, were created as part of the university's 50th anniversary celebration.

Gonfaloni was originally the name given to local "neighborhood" meetings in medieval Florence. Each "neighborhood" had its own flag and coat of arms, and the word gonfalon eventually became associated with the flag.

Universities and colleges around the world have adopted gonfalons to increase the ceremonial nature of commencement exercises. The top portion of each college's gonfalon is the designated color for that unit; white is the background color for each of the college's symbols, as well as one of the university's colors.

Honor Societies

Alpha Phi Sigma is the national honor society that recognizes scholastic excellence in the field of criminal justice sciences. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through gold and blue cords, stoles or medallions as a part of their academic regalia.

Alpha Psi Omega is the national honor society formed to recognize and promote excellence in the study and practice of theatre arts. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through the blue and gold cords as a part of their academic regalia.

Beta Beta Beta is an honor and professional society for students of the biological sciences. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through green and red cords and/or a medallion on a green ribbon as a part of their academic regalia.

Beta Gamma Sigma is the international honor society that recognizes scholastic excellence in collegiate schools of business accredited by AACSB International. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through royal blue and gold cords, stoles or medallions as a part of their academic regalia.

Chi Sigma Iota is the international honor society for counseling students, counselor educators and professionals. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through white and blue honor cords or stoles as a part of their academic regalia.

Eta Sigma Gamma is the national honorary for the health education profession. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through green and gold cords as a part of their academic regalia.

Kappa Delta Pi is the national honor society in education. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through purple and green cords or medallions as a part of their academic regalia.

Lambda Pi Eta is the honor society of the National Communication Association. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through the red and white honors double cords worn as a part of their academic regalia.

Phi Alpha Theta is the international honor society in history. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through red satin sashes as a part of their academic regalia.

Honor Societies

Phi Beta Delta is an honor society that recognizes international study, service and research. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through a bronze medallion worn on a yellow and blue ribbon as a part of their academic regalia.

Phi Kappa Phi is the national scholastic honor society organized to promote excellence in all academic disciplines. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through blue and gold cords or a medallion on a blue ribbon as a part of their academic regalia.

Pi Alpha Alpha is the national honor society formed to recognize and promote excellence in the study and practice of public administration. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through blue and gold cords or medallions as a part of their academic regalia.

Pi Kappa Lambda is the national music honor society. Comprised of faculty and students elected by their peers, the society is dedicated to excellence in musical and academic endeavors. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through gold cords as a part of their academic regalia.

Pi Sigma Alpha is the national honor society for undergraduate and graduate students of political science. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through red, white and black cords as a part of their academic regalia.

Psi Chi is the national honor society in psychology. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through gold double cords with blue and gold tassels as a part of their academic regalia.

Sigma Delta Pi is the national honor society formed to recognize and promote excellence in the study and practice of Spanish. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through gold cords as a part of their academic regalia.

Sigma Tau Delta is the International English Honor Society. Candidates who are members of this honor society are identified through black and red cords as a part of their academic regalia.
